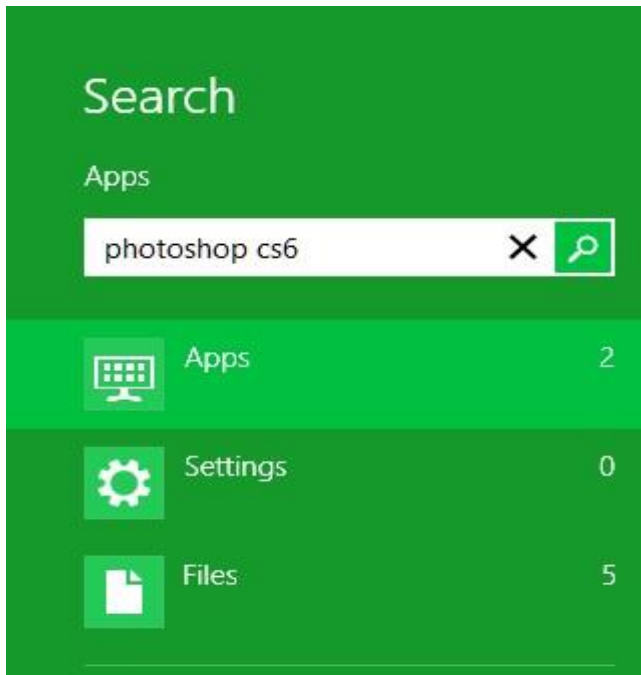

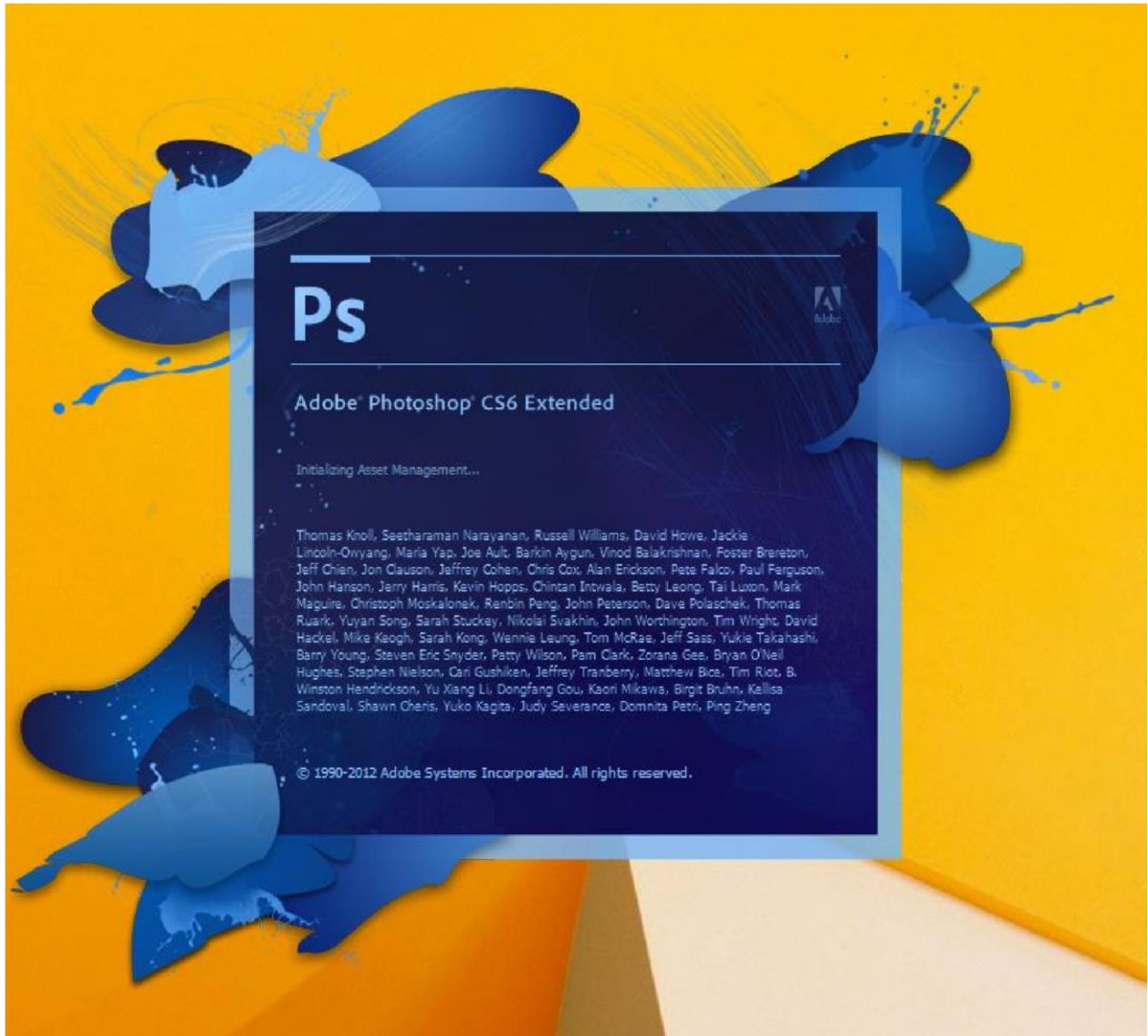
### Opening Photoshop

If you're using Window 8

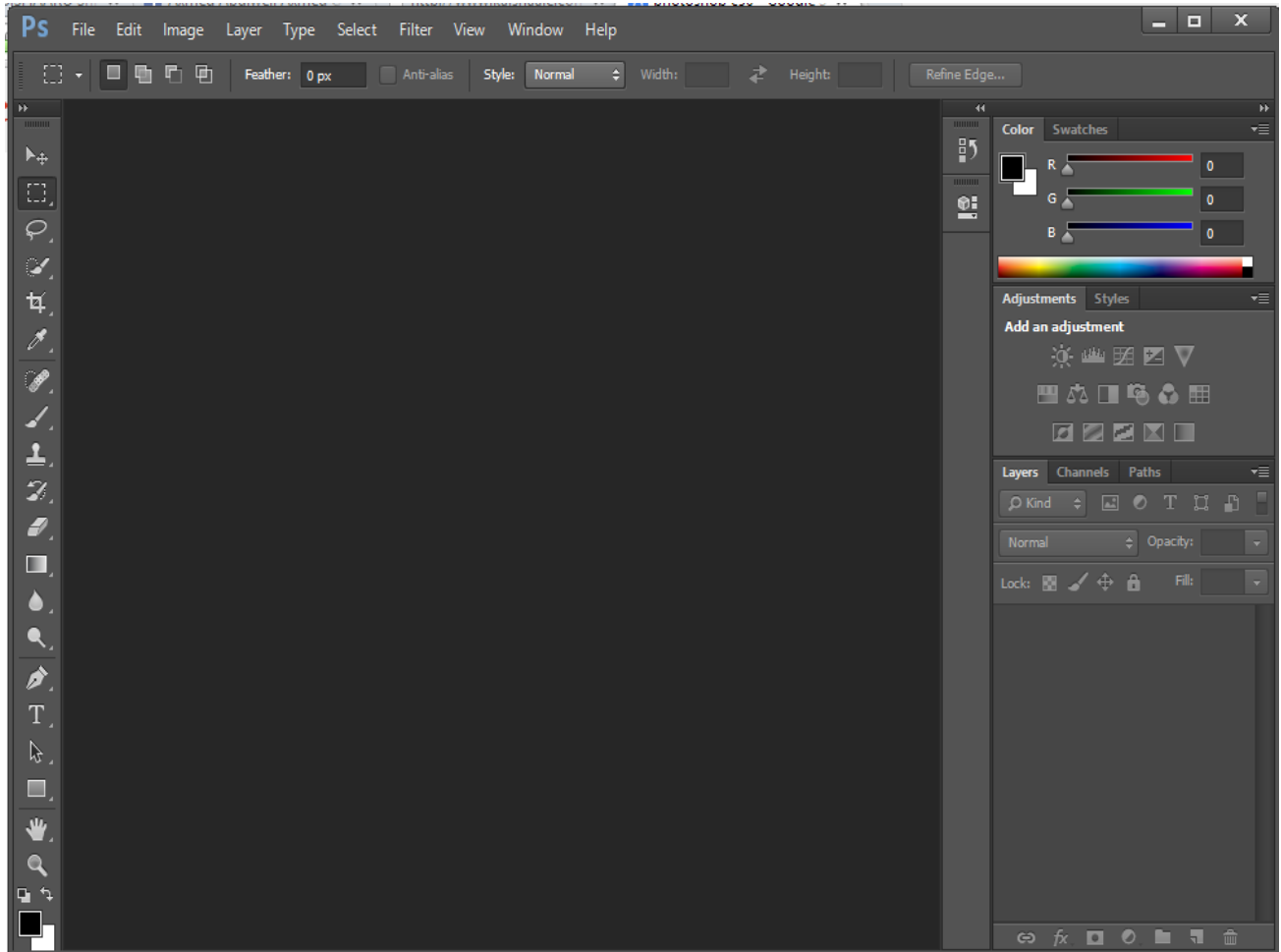
Start Screen/Type Photoshop

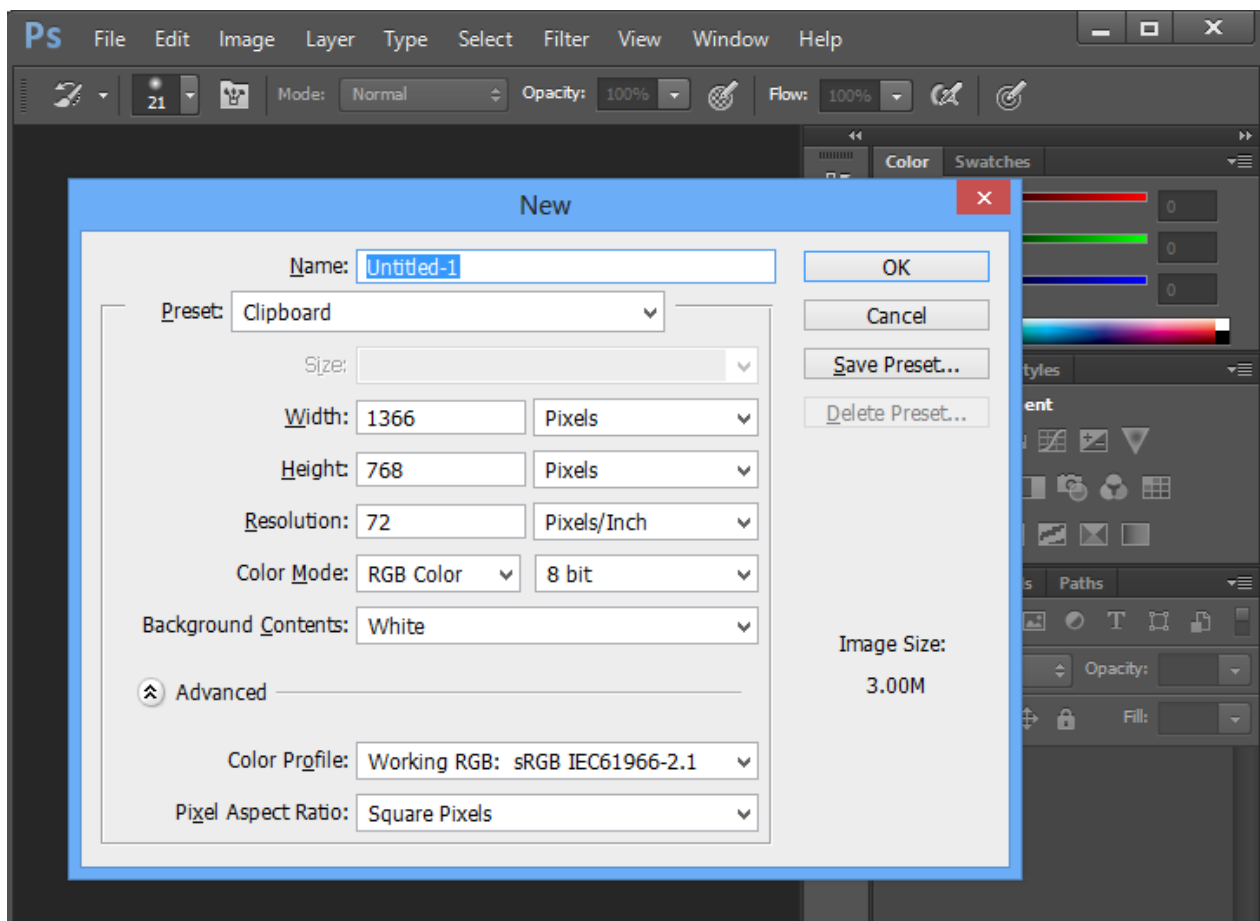

### Steps:

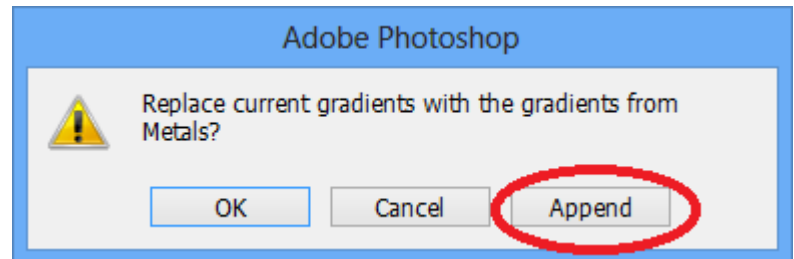
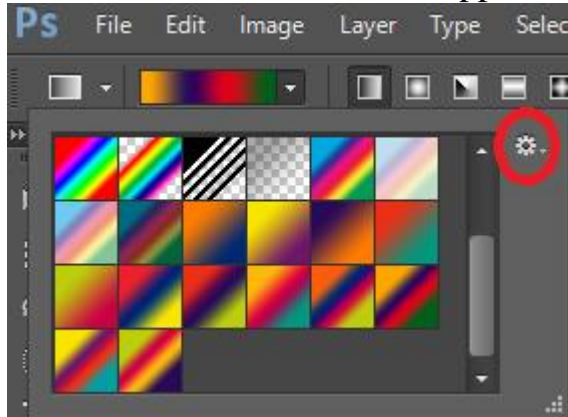
click gradient Tool (search Tool box)

### Steps


Press CTRL+N and select the size you want

Read steps.

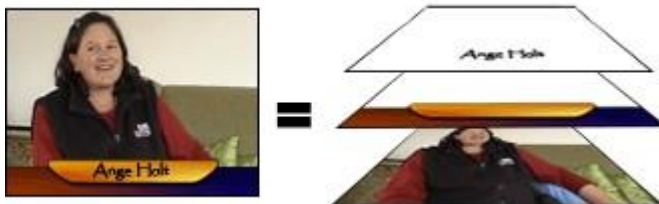


## Lesson 08: Layers

Every Photoshop file contains one or more layers. New files are generally created

With a background layer, which contains a color or an image

Layers are a very important part of graphics work. If you have never used layers before, make the effort to learn how they work.



A Photoshop image file (.psd) can be made up of numerous independent layers which are overlaid on top of each other.

In the example shown here, a single image file is made up of three layers. Any part of a layer which contains no image information is transparent, so layers

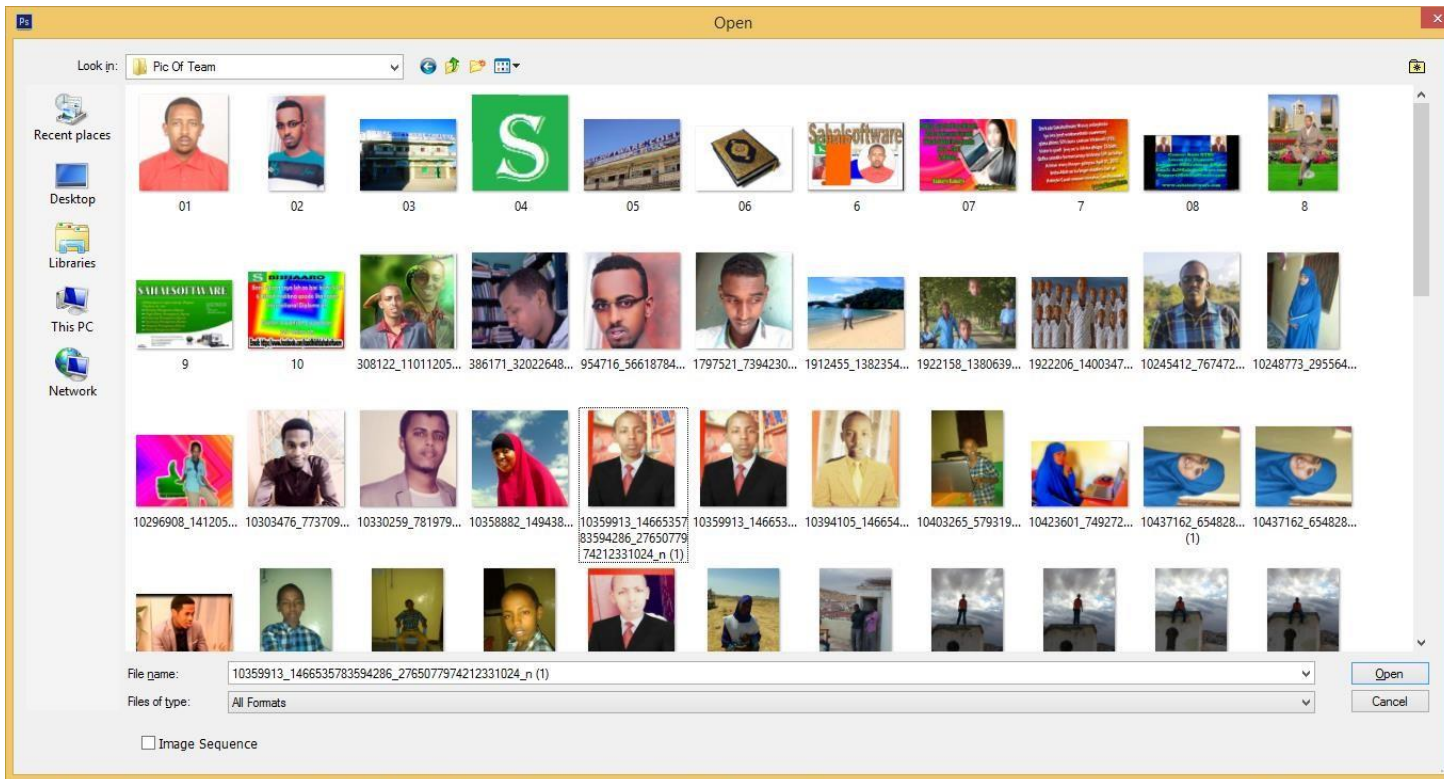
below are visible in these areas. Each whole layer can also have different opacity settings, so some layers can be partially or completely transparent.



Note:

Rename the every layer and give appropriate name. Also you can change the way ordered by dragging.

## Lesson 09: Open, Save Photoshop image Opening image



### 3 step to open Image

Step One: Choose File > Open, and select the file you want to open.

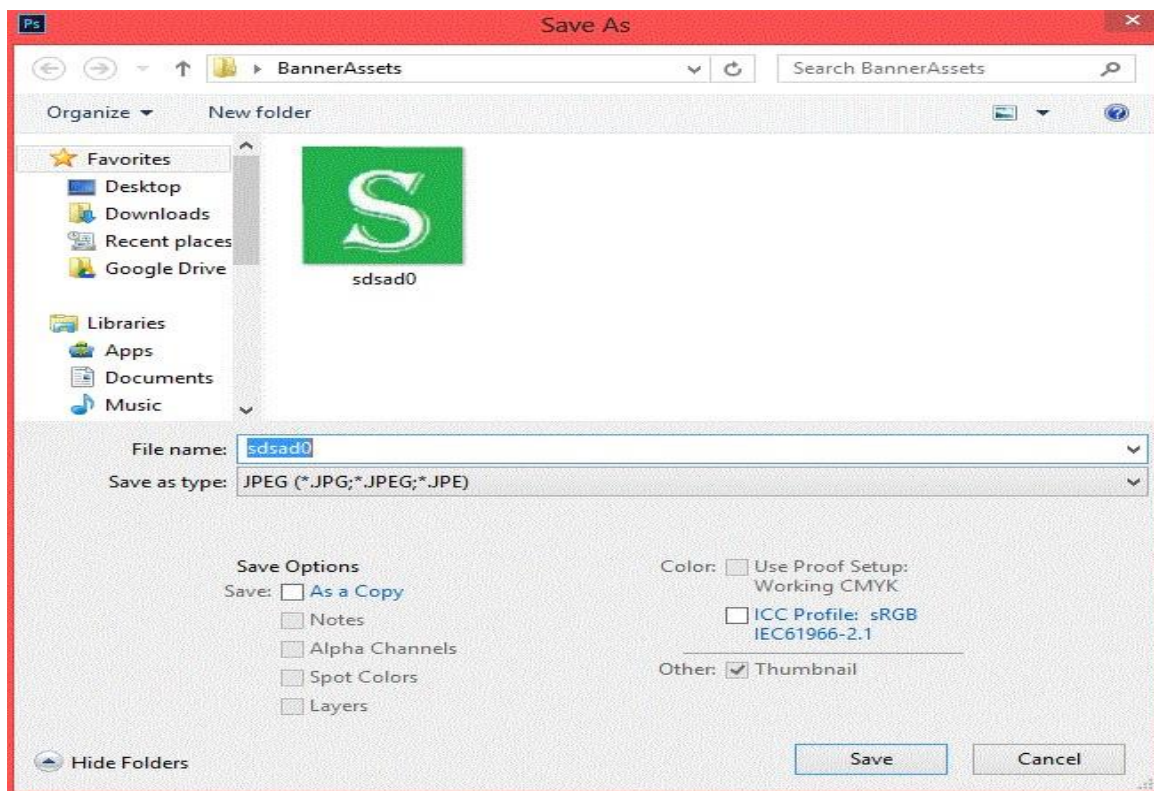
Step two: Double Click Any Way to workspace, and select the file you want to open. Then choose the desired format from the Open As pop-up menu, and click Open.

Step three: TRY

### Saving image

To save an image in the native Photoshop file format (PSD), you would simply choose File > Save or Ctrl-S (Command-S on Mac). To save the file under a different name, you would choose the File > Save As command (Shift-Ctrl-S on Windows or Shift-Command-S on Mac).

JPEG - JPEG is best for photos when you need to keep the file size small and don't mind giving up some quality for a significant reduction in size. JPEG is not suitable for images with text, large blocks of color, or simple shapes, because crisp lines will blur and colors can shift. Only JPEG offers the options of Baseline, Baseline Optimized, or Progressive.



PSD, PDD - PSD and PDD are Photoshop's native format. Use PSD when you need to preserve layers, transparency, adjustment layers, masks, clipping paths, layer styles, blending modes, vector text and shapes, etc. The PDD extension was used in Adobe Photo Deluxe (now discontinued), but it is identical to PSD format and the two can be used interchangeably.

### Lesson 10: Moving Tool

First Place in the workspace Picture, Text & background

Click moving tool

Press CTRL + Click Mouse the object you want to drag.



### Lesson 11: Rectangular Marque Tool

First Place in the workspace Picture, or Shapes

Click Rectangular Marque

Drag the area of the picture you need to cut

Press CTRL + C

Open a new tab

Press CTRL+V

Lesson 12: Elliptical Marque Tool (circle)

First Place in the workspace Picture, or Shapes

Right click Rectangular Marque select Elliptical Marque tool

Drag the area of the picture you need to cut

Press CTRL + C

Open a new tab

Press CTRL+V

Lesson 10: Lasso Tool (Removing Background)

First Place in the workspace Picture, or Shapes

Click Lasso Tool

Drag the area of the picture you need to cut

Press CTRL + C

Open a new tab

Press CTRL+V

You can change the style of this picture in the style box

Lesson 13: polygonal lasso tool (Easy tool for removing background):

First Place in the workspace Picture, or Shapes

Right Click Lasso Tool and Select polygonal Lasso Tool

Drag the area of the picture you need to cut

Press CTRL + C

Open a new tab

Press CTRL+V

You can change the style of this picture in the style box

Lesson 14: Magic Tool (Removing Background two parts like sky)

First Place in the workspace Picture, or Shapes  
Click Magic Tool  
click the area of the picture you need to cut  
Press CTRL + C  
Open a new tab  
Press CTRL+V  
You can change the style of this picture in the style box

### Lesson 15: Adding Shapes

First Place in the workspace Picture  
Right click Rectangular tool and select Custom shape tool  
In the option bar select shapes you need  
Drag the shape in the workspace  
Then change the style and color

### Lesson 16: Brush Tool

First Place in the workspace Picture, or Shapes  
Click Brush Tool  
Select the brush you want in the option bar  
Also use the Brush Presets Box in the Windows menu  
Then use the brush in the workspace

## Note: you can use a 3d Text

- Type your text
- Then right click Layer text
- And select New 3D Ext.....
- Then process steps by using option bar.
